Details

He resigned after being assigned to administrative leave after presented with charges pending.

On 11-6-08 he failed to promptly come to the aid of an officer in need of assistance.

He failed to comply with instructions not to relieve on duty personnel without exigent circumstances.

He instructed the Area E-5 booking officer to sleep in his vehicle while on duty.

On 5-13-09 he used unreasonable judgment in issuing parking citations around the state house.

Absent 31 days (5 documented, 7 unpaid)

He resigned after presented with charges from a traffic detail in district A1.

He was presented with retirement purposes, accepting charges pending.

From Oct 20-26, 2007, he worked 96.75 hours. 5th violation of this rule.

Boston Medical Center staff complained that he slept in the hallway while guarding a prisoner, twice.

He lied about and later admitted to steroid use. must submit to random testing.

He used steroids in 2002. must submit to random testing.
